Hi everyone,

We've had a very busy March and April at Treescape® and there has been lots of great work going on, which you will see in this issue.

On the safety front, we've made excellent progress and reduced our injury rate by 67% from this time last year. This improvement has come from building greater awareness around risk and engaging closely with our teams. On that note, we have now formally launched our Safety Engagements where Board members and Senior Managers conduct site visits to discuss health and safety matters and better understand how we operate and the risks we face.

We're well underway developing our green asset management offering, with a fantastic project on Te Pane o Mataoho (Mangere Mountain), where we are involved in the planting of thousands of new native trees. We've also had to literally tidy up our own back yard when a neighbouring tree fell and damaged our toilet block. It just goes to show how diverse our work actually is.

We've been recognised by Wellington Electricity for helping them to meet their network reliability targets, and our Brisbane based teams have done an amazing job to raise money for the McGrath Foundation. Great examples of how we contribute to our communities.

Lastly, in addition to supporting and recognising great talent in the Wintec top arboriculture student awards, we have expanded our search to the UK where I attended two job fairs, undertook a large number of interviews, and visited 8 arboriculture colleges. The uptake has been great, and we are looking forward to a number of UK arborists joining us soon.




### Did you see us on Seven Sharp?


## Pink Stumps Day
